Overview: Future Academies is seeking to appoint an exceptional teacher of Latin based at our newest secondary school, Laureate Academy. We are a small multi-academy trust and we offer our students a knowledge-rich education, giving them access to high-quality, classic texts, and lessons from subject experts. We strive to give our students a rigorously academic education that puts them on a level playing field with their independently-educated peers. We believe in pitching lessons high, whilst supporting all of our students to make progress. We place special importance on the study of Latin from Key Stage 2 to A-level.

The role: As the teacher of Latin, you will be responsible for delivering our new Key Stage 3 curriculum to Year 7. This is a fully resourced curriculum that is common across our family of secondary schools, and fully supported by our Latin Trust Lead. Our Latin curriculum has been carefully sequenced and designed with the importance of memory and retention in mind. It draws on the latest research in education and cognitive science, emphasising the role of direct-instruction and retrieval practice, to ensure that all of our students make excellent progress regardless of their starting point.

This year, we have five Year 7 Latin classes each receiving 2 lessons per week. Over the next two years the key Stage 3 curriculum will include Year 8 and Year 9, and we expect to see the introduction of both GCSE and A-Level Latin and Ancient History courses. The successful candidate will play a central role in this growth, offering excellent opportunities for career development.

- To teach Year 7 Latin, delivering high-quality and carefully planned lessons.
- To lead the implementation of our common curriculum in Key Stage 3 Latin.
- To work with our Latin Trust Lead to ensure you are familiar with curriculum plans and resources. This will include attending training and insight days at our other secondary schools, to help bring best-practice in Latin to Laureate Academy.
- To contribute to the wider life and ethos of Laureate Academy.
